

Dear Student:

You will be taking your AP Exam(s) soon. If you have not attended a preadministration session, you need to arrange an appointment immediately. This is mandatory in order to take an AP Exam.

You should bring the following items to the exam room:

- • Several sharpened No. 2 pencils with erasers for all responses on your multiple-choice answer sheet. (Students outside the U.S.: bring HB or No. 2 pencils.)
- • Pens with black or dark blue ink for completing areas on the exam booklet covers and for free-response questions in most exams.
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- • Your 6-digit school code. Homeschooled students will be provided with their state's or country's homeschool code at the time of the exam.
- • A watch that does not have internet access, does not beep, and does not have an alarm.
- • Up to two approved calculators with the necessary capabilities if you're taking an AP Biology, Calculus, Chemistry, Physics, or Statistics Exam. Visit exploreap.org/calculatorpolicy to learn more about the calculator policy for each of these exams and for a list of authorized calculators.
- • A ruler or straightedge **only** if you're taking an AP Physics Exam. Protractors are not allowed.
- • Your AP Student Pack. If you don't attend the school where you're taking the exam, you should also bring a current government-issued or school-issued ID.
- • Your Social Security number for identification purposes (optional).
- • If you've been approved for testing accommodations, bring your SSD Student Accommodation letter to verify your approval.

You should not bring the following to the exam room*:

- • Electronic equipment (cell phone, smartphone, smartwatch, laptop, tablet computer, etc.), portable listening or recording devices (MP3 player, iPod, etc.), cameras or other photographic equipment, devices that can access the internet, or other electronic or communication devices. School-owned recording devices and equipment are allowed **only** for the AP French, German, Italian, and Spanish Language and Culture Exams and the AP Music Theory Exam.
- • Books, compasses, protractors, mechanical pencils, No. 3 pencils, correction fluid, dictionaries, highlighters, notes, or colored pencils.
- • Scratch paper; notes can be made on portions of the exam booklets or, for Chinese Language and Culture and Japanese Language and Culture **only**, on scratch paper provided by the proctor.
- • Watches that beep or have an alarm.
- • Computers.
- • Protractors.
- • Reference guides, keyboard maps, or other typing instructions.
- • Ear plugs.
- • Clothing or shoes with subject-related information.
- • Food or drink.
- • Clipboards.
- • Rulers or straightedges (except as noted above).
- • Calculators (except as noted above)

*Unless this has been preapproved as an accommodation by the College Board Services for Students with Disabilities office prior to the test date.

You are required to arrive no later than 30 minutes prior to your exam: 7:30 a.m. for the morning administration and 11:30 a.m. for the afternoon administration. Students may not be dismissed until an exam has officially ended; do not ask to leave early if you finish before the end of the exam. If you play a sport or have a job, it is your responsibility to inform your coach or employer of your AP Exam obligation, and arrangements should be made accordingly.

Get a good night's rest before your exam, and eat a nutritious breakfast. You are allowed to bring a snack and beverage for your 10-minute break. However, food and drink are prohibited in the exam room. It is advisable to bring a sweater, in case the room temperature is below your comfort level.

You are required to abide by the policies of both the College Board and Live Oak High School during the exam period. Any misconduct will be reported and could jeopardize your AP Exam score. If you decide not to take an exam, please inform me as soon as possible prior to the test administration.
